
#### - THE LATEST RESEARCH ON MARIJUANA -

#### **POTENCY**

## THC is the chemical in marijuana that produces the high.

- 1960s & 1970s THC level = 1% 3%
- 1980s & 2000s THC level = 1% 5%
- **Today's THC level** = 14% 30% (dry form)

= 25% - 99% (vape form)

#### **MENTAL ILLNESS**

## Marijuana has been found to be involved in as much as 50% of cases of psychosis, schizophrenia, and schizophrenic episodes. (3)

- Not using marijuana in youth could help 500,000 adults avoid mental health issues. (4)
- "Teenagers who use (marijuana) just once or twice may end up with changes to the structure of their brain.". (5)
- "In 2014, people who had cannabis use disorder accounted for 11% of all the psychosis cases in the ER, (90,000 cases, 250 a day; triple the number in 2006)". (6)

#### **OTHER DRUGS**

- Children who use marijuana are 85 times more likely to use cocaine than non-marijuana users. (7)
- "Of 23 (states where marijuana is legal), 78% had a statistically significant acceleration of opioid death rates after legalization." (8)

#### **ADDICTION**

### 1 in 6 teens who use marijuana will become addicted. (12)

- 50% of daily users will become addicted.
- 75% of 12 17-year-olds who are in a drug treatment facility are seeking treatment for marijuana as their primary addiction.

#### **EDUCATION**

## States with legalized marijuana have higher dropout rates. (1)


- 10 % increase in high-school dropout among 12th-graders (1)
- Teens under age 17 who use marijuana every day are 60 percent less likely to graduate from high school, compared with their peers who have never used the drug, (2)


#### OTHER EFFECTS

- Marijuana is the #1 substance involved in deaths from child abuse and neglect in the states that track the substances linked to child abuse. (9)
- Almost half of teenagers who regularly use pot admit they've gotten behind the wheel while stoned. (10)
- Young people who use cannabis more than 10 days a month are 2.5 times more likely to have a stroke. (11)
- A young person diagnosed with cannabis use disorder has a 47% 52% greater risk of being hospitalized for an irregular heartbeat. (11)
- "Those who were exposed to marijuana in the womb...had elevated psychopathology, problems with depression and anxiety, as well as ADHD... and lower birth weight". (13)
- In the US, 1 in 25 pregnant women report using marijuana. (14)


