# Public School In-Class Trainings

Omni Youth Programs equips students throughout Sacramento's public schools with the necessary resources and knowledge to apply prevention practices in their own lives and communities.

Students are taught about the dangers of alcohol, marijuana, opioids, fentanyl, vaping and other drugs through interactive workshops presented by Omni staff.



In class workshops offer the opportunity for public school's and districts to train their youth to practice alcohol, marijuana, and other drug prevention skills with their peers.

Students are given the opportunity to ask questions, engage in larger conversations, and learn current facts about drug trends facing their schools and communities.



# Model Programs

Equipping the community with knowledge and skills to facilitate evidence based model programs that prevent underage alcohol, marijuana, opioid & other drug use.

Omni Youth Programs trained TEENS, PARENTS, TEACHERS, PROFESSIONALS, AND OTHER MEMBERS OF THE COMMUNITY to become Certified Model Program Facilitators. This year's newly trained facilitators represent schools & school districts, non-profits, youth groups, and more. Each trainee plans to conduct the program in their own neighborhood, school or faith center with people they already have existing relationships with, cultural understanding of, and trust and familiarity with.



#### **ACTIVE PARENTING OF TEENS**

Professionals received training to become Certified Model Program Facilitators in the Active Parenting of Teens curriculum. They will then lead their own parent groups using high energy activities, lively discussions, and engaging videos while exploring issues of alcohol, drugs, sexual health, and violence within their families.

#### **TEENS IN ACTION**

Teens & youth professionals received training to become Certified Model Program Facilitators in Teens in Action. They will then lead teen groups on the teen brain, understanding parents, negative vs. positive influences, the power of choice, and alcohol and drug use. The program provides youth with critical skill-building and the opportunity for professional and leadership skills.

# Cultural Orientation

Omni Youth Programs developed the series after seeing the need for cultural education in our community.

Drawing upon our agency's extensive work with many cultures, our experience, setbacks and successes led us to develop a vastly different approach to gain the trust and involvement of immigrant and refugee communities.

With the voices and presence of our County's diverse cultural members, we conducted this series to help guide other agencies through the process and have success providing much needed services by those unsure about receiving them.



- In-depth history of the culture, how other cultures differ.
- Challenges navigating the culture within everyday environments.
- What responsive services look like from the perspective of the culture.
- Specific & unique ways cultural views differ on youth drug use.
- Concerns, suspicions and fears people from the culture may have towards agency's offering services, and why.
- How needs and expectations may differ from what you are offering.
- Strategies and adaptations you may need to make to engage & partner with individuals from the culture.


